

# Seraquin®



*Nutritional supplement for dogs*  
60 x 2g chewable tablets

Seraquin is a nutritional supplement for the support of normal joint function in dogs.

## How to use Seraquin®

Seraquin is very palatable to most dogs and can be fed directly to the dog as a treat or it can be crumbled and mixed with the normal feed

Initial period of 4-6 weeks (or as recommended by the veterinarian)

Less than	10 kg:	1 tablet daily
	10 – 20 kg:	2 tablets daily
	20 – 40 kg:	3 tablets daily
More than	40 kg:	4 tablets daily

After the initial 4-6 weeks feeding period, the daily amount can normally be gradually reduced by ½ tablet for the following week. This can be repeated on a weekly basis until a level of half the initial amount is reached.

If your dog's condition changes during this period, consult your vet.

## Each chewable tablet contains:

Glucosamine HCl	500 mg
Chondroitin sulphate	380 mg
Standardised turmeric extract	50 mg

**Composition:** Glucosamine HCl, inactivated yeast, saccharose, chondroitin sulphate, hydrolysed chicken protein, standardised turmeric extract, glucose, maize protein

## Additives per tablet: Excipient (E470)

Carbohydrate	58 %
Crude protein	25 %
Crude ash	7 %
Moisture	7 %
Crude fat	2 %
Crude fibre	1 %

Glucosamine, Chondroitin and turmeric extract (Curcumin) are important for the maintenance of healthy cartilage and normal joint function.

To be stored in a dry place at a temperature below 30°C.

## *Frequently asked questions*

Q: Will my dog eat Seraquin?

A: Seraquin is very palatable to most dogs and can be fed directly to your dog as a treat or it can be crumbled and mixed with its normal food.

Q: Can I give Seraquin with my dog's current treatment?

A: Yes, there are no known interactions between Seraquin and other products. This is because Seraquin is composed of naturally occurring Chondroitin, Glucosamine and Turmeric.

Q: How long should I give my dog Seraquin?

A: This very much depends on your dog and your vet's advice. Many animals may require long-term use of Seraquin. As a guide most pet owners find that after the initial 4-6 weeks feeding period, the daily amount can normally be gradually reduced by  $\frac{1}{2}$  tablet per week until a level of half the initial amount of Seraquin is reached. If your pet's condition changes during this period, consult your vet.

Q: Are there any side effects?

A: As far as we know there are no untoward effects.
